Program Summary Associate of Applied Science

The Nursing Program offers a variety of options in a highly in-demand field, including becoming a Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) or getting an associate degree in nursing (ADN). Both programs provide students with the training and skills necessary to succeed. By partnering with local hospitals, students get the hands-on training in a real-world environment while completing their clinical hours. A transition program is also offered for those looking to move from an LVN or paramedic to an ADN.
