Hill College's Echocardiography and Vascular Technology Programs are recognized by Cardiovascular Credentialing International (CCI) and the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) and provide eligibility to sit for the Sonography Principles & Instrumentation (SPI) exam and then complete a specialty exam such as Adult Cardiac or Vascular Technology.

While the state of Texas does not require echocardiographers or vascular technologists to have a license to work in the state, professional certification through the American Registry for Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ARDMS) is preferred or may be required by the employer.

Please be aware that there may be additional professional licensure or certification requirements like professional examinations, continuing education, background checks, years of work experience, fingerprinting requirements, etc. which are not covered by academic program's curriculum. Additional requirements may differ by state. Current and prospective students are strongly encouraged to consult with their program coordinator to provide their location or the state at which they desire to be licensed or certified to seek information and additional guidance.
