Hill College's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) program is recognized by the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) and the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) and provides eligibility to sit for the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) Paramedic exam. Additionally, as a prerequisite recognized by Texas DSHS, Hill College's EMS program provides eligibility to sit for the National Registry of EMTs Basic exam.
