Hill College's Nursing programs are recognized by the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) and provide eligibility to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN) at the conclusion of the Vocation Nursing (VN) program and eligibility to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) at the conclusion of the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program.
