Dear Friends of the Texas Heritage Mxuseum,

In December, the Hill College Texas Heritage Museum reached another milestone in the journey toward obtaining accreditation from the American Alliance of Museums. I submitted the museum's self-study report and all required compliance documentation, which consisted of over 800 pages! In January, we received positive feedback from the Accreditation Program staff on the self-study submitted. This self-study is a testament to the work of the entire Hill College community of staff, faculty, students, alumni, and community partnerships. It is such a privilege to work with such a great group of individuals. We are deeply indebted to the dozens of members of our campus community who participated in this process.

Our site visit has been accelerated by a few months to ensure that the visit will take place when the campus will be active with students. We have a long journey ahead and have many more steps to complete this year, including the following:

- The site visit, scheduled to take place on March 27 and 28
- The visiting site committee will complete their site visit report in April
- The Accreditation Commission will meet in June, at which time they will review the museum's self-study report and site-visit report and make one of the following decisions:
- Grant accreditation (usually for 10 years)
- Tables its decision for one year so specific issues can be addressed
- Denies accreditation due to failure to meet multiple core standards and/or for major systemic problems
- Defers a decision to gather additional information
- We will be notified in July of the Accreditation Commission's decision

WWI Uniform Grouping of Louis William Benkendorfer (Benkley): **Recent Donation from Frank Jasek**

Louis William Benkendorfer (Benkley) was born on November 04, 1892, the son of Louis and Emilie Benkendorfer. The family farmed near the community of the City of West, Texas. Louis William was one of eight children. In the fall of 1917, he started his service in World War I as a private in the Regiment 144th Infantry Company "E" at Camp Bowie, Fort Worth, Texas. This unit went overseas with the 36th Division, arriving in France in July, 1918. In October 1918, the regiment became a part of the 4th French Army and participated in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive (Champagne). German artillery, gas attacks and machine gun fire took a large toll on the advancing Texas unit during this offensive. The 144th Infantry suffered 369 casualties in the war, the second largest toll of the infantry regiments in the division. Louis was then transferred, promoted to a Corporal, and reassigned to the 23rd Infantry Company "A" Regiment, which was assigned to the 2nd Infantry Division. He then returned to the United States in August 1919. He married Della Havemann on August 15, 1920, in Waco, Texas. They were married for 60 years; Louis passed away on November 10, 1980.
