LETTER FROM THE DEAN

Dear Texas Heritage Museum Members,

We had some exciting events this fall semester partnering with the Hill College faculty and students, and community members!

On October 23, at the museum during the closing reception, artist Michael Odom presented to 60 Hill College students in Tom Sale's and Mary Ann Cunningham's Art Appreciation classes. This art exhibit titled, "Texas and France," small landscape paintings by Michael Odom, was on display from Sept. 4, 2019 through Oct. 24, 2019.

On November 20, Kathleen Miller's US History classes held a Civil War event at the museum with 100 people in attendance. During this event we had over 50 students prepare different dishes, using authentic Civil War recipes that were judged by the Hill College faculty and staff. 

Historical Research Center Donation



The THM recently acquired a WWII sailor uniform grouping of Seamen First Class Andy William Hankins. He served on the USS Spectacle (AM-305)



which was a steel-hulled admirable class minesweeper.

On May 22, 1945, early that morning, at 8:05, a diving kamikaze crashed into the minesweeper, striking the ship under her port 40-millimeter gun tub, causing extensive damage and blowing

many of her crew overboard. Her rudder jammed. She dropped anchor to avoid running over her men in the water. At 8:15, USS LSM-135 began picking up survivors; but, 15 minutes later, the medium landing ship was also hit by a kamikaze and burst into flames. USS Spectacle's losses were: 11 killed outright, four who died of wounds, six wounded, and 14 missing in action. Andy Hankins was one of the 11 killed in action on this day. He was buried on Okinawa Island and later reburied in Whitesboro, Texas. Pat Dunklin who is the niece of Andy Hankins donated his uniform grouping.

EAST TEXAS GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

On Nov. 9, at the East Texas Genealogical Society in Tyler, Texas, John Versluis, Dean of the Texas Heritage Museum gave an overview of the holdings at the Museum.

During this presentation, he used Second Lieutenant Andrew Birdsall Briscoe, Eighth Texas Cavalry, Terry's Texas Rangers, Co. K. and Private William Newby, 40th Illinois Infantry Co. D. as an example of what one might find researching Civil War Confederate and Union ancestors in the Historical Research Center.
