The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of a student's educational record that is not considered "directory" information. Educational records, including financial aid and student account records, are considered confidential and will not be released without written consent from the student, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. For this reason, it is necessary for the Financial Aid Office at Hill College to obtain permission from a student in order to release financial aid information not excluded by FERPA laws.
